The Camp runs from 7:30 AM until 4:00 PM each day.

Our camp provides a supportive and nurturing environment for high school girls to explore and develop basic skills in construction and safety areas such as carpentry, electrical, plumbing, sheet metal, landscaping, heavy equipment, surveying, and masonry.

Camp NAWIC offers high school girls a gender-neutral environment to learn and practice new skills. It helps develop greater self-confidence and better self-esteem for girls who tackle challenging projects and successfully complete them. Camp NAWIC develops a “we can do it” mind set along with leadership and teamwork.

Our Camp introduces high school girls to role models who have achieved success in all areas of construction: from tradespeople to engineers, architects to accountants, project superintendents, supervisors and business owners to clerical support.

Camp NAWIC introduces students to valuable trade programs and careers. Our Camp is offered FREE to the campers, and is supported by Future Construction Leaders Foundation, NAWIC San Diego, and our local construction industry partners.
